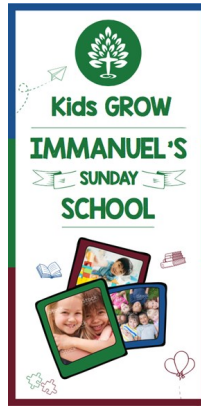


Fall Session Begins the Week of September 24
